## LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

- 1. Youth Council** — A group of young people interested in democracy, who work with the League of Women Voters to organize their peers and take action. [Learn more.](#)
- 2. Fellowships & Internships** — Internships in voter engagement, voter education, and youth voter outreach are available. Internships require a few flexible hours a week working in support of League projects, and interns receive a small stipend. [Learn more.](#)
- 3. Organizers + Voting Captains** — We will provide training and support for students who want to step into leadership positions.
- 4. Speakers' Bureau** — Students with an interest in public speaking can join our Speakers' Bureau, which meets regularly to practice the skills needed to be an effective speaker.
