

Vote 16 Maine

- Had a bill in legislative session for state and local elections only.
- Sponsored by Senator Hickman with 7 other co-sponsors.
- Public hearing went amazing, but bill was killed in work session with no public discussion.
- Focusing on longer campaign and getting out of committee in the 2027 session.


