Board Operations

- Policy Review Ann Luther motioned to approve the policies adopted by the LWVME Board of Directors. Barbara McDade seconded. Unanimously approved.
- Fundraising Update
 - WhyNot (grant report submitted February 21st)
 - LWVUS pass-thru grant (awarded February 23rd) LWVME has been awarded \$1,800 for naturalization efforts
 - O AVR grant award (awarded March 9th) LWVME has been awarded \$12,000 for work on Automatic Voter Registration.
 - Community Conversations proposal. David Sammarco is working on this.
 Still in process.
 - Archives proposal continuing to explore a grant for this effort.

Voter Service & Education Update

- Voter Registration Spring drives, Common Ground Fair?
 - One person should have charge of the data so that it can be used in grant applications.
 - Common Ground Fair applications must be submitted to MOFGA by March 31,
 2017. It costs \$10 for a table and someone will need to be there all 3 days
 - Naturalization ceremonies LWVPA has been invited to USCIS meetings with other community organizations
