VOTER REGISTRATION UPDATE



Voter registrations continue to roll in. Year-to-date, LWVME has registered 1325 voters at the following events:

- 17 Naturalization Ceremonies registering 362 new voters, or 55% of the new citizens
- 24 community events registering
 120 voters
- 37 high school and college events registering 843 voters

If we compare the combined high school, college and community voter drives through the end of September both this year and in 2016, the difference is amazing. 2018 = 963 new voters. 2016 = 271 new voters. This is more than 3 times the number of new voter registrations so far this year! Kudos to all League Members who have helped make this happen. LWVPA TESTIFIES ON NON-CITIZEN VOTING

Congratulations to the LWVPA! As a recently reactivated Chapter, we are just starting to practice our issue advocacy skills. This summer, the Portland City Council heard testimony from individuals and organizations on approving a referendum for the ballot asking Portland voters to grant all residents the right to vote in local Portland elections. Since the League has not studied this issue, we testified neither for nor against, trying to provide some historical context and some pros and cons. The Council decided not to put this question before Portland voters this year.
