#### Recap – *Evicted* Book Discussion


Participants in the *Evicted* book discussion at the Portland Public Library brought a wealth of different backgrounds to the discussion of affordable housing at the national, state, and local level. The varied backgrounds of participants offered the group insights into the challenges facing a small scale landlord, a Portland area rent control advocate, and a participant in foreclosure court proceedings as well as personal stories about family, friends, and neighbors dealing with housing issues. The discussion was wide-ranging, but all agreed that Matthew Desmond's book improved our understanding of how important secure housing is to overcoming poverty, joblessness, and food insecurity. Senator Susan Collins was the Keynote Speaker at the Presidents Day Naturalization Ceremony at Ocean Gateway in Portland on February 22, 2018.

Sixty-six new citizens from 27 countries were sworn in that day. Our team of seven LWVPA volunteers registered 38 new voters.
