This was a busy summer for Nationalization ceremonies! We registered new citizens to vote at four ceremonies in June, two ceremonies each in July and August, and three are scheduled for September. YTD we have registered 303 new citizens to vote, which is 49% of those who received their citizenship at the ceremonies. There are eight more ceremonies scheduled through the end of the year.
