## MOVING FORWARD WITH THE PRIMARY STUDY



The LWVPA held its second Primary Study Consensus Meeting on Saturday, May 19th, from 9 AM to noon. We were happy to have so many members attend and managed to come to consensus on

all the questions following animated discussions of the issues. Maine's four other local units conducted their Primary Study consensus meetings during May and early June. All units have now submitted their results to the Primary Study Committee, whose members will consolidate the five sets of results and work with the State Board to develop a LWVME policy position statement.

### LWVPA PLANS FOR 2018–2019 ACTIVITIES

The LWVPA Board held their annual planning retreat on June 9<sup>th</sup> and continues to work on the details. Once again, the Board has committed to planning and implementing at least one monthly event in addition to the LWVPA Board meetings. Highlights include voter information drives and voter information sessions throughout September and October, and a post–election Whine and Wine gathering in November. In December, we will honor our members with a holiday reception. We will continue our book discussions—one in February and another in April. Member Elizabeth Miller has volunteered to organize these discussions and will be starting with Jon Meacham's <a href="The Soul of America: The Battle for Our Better Angels">The Soul of America: The Battle for Our Better Angels</a> in February. Details about these events will be included in the monthly newsletters.

### 1168 NEW VOTER REGISTRATIONS YTD



In 2017, we registered a total of 543 new voters. It is amazing that we have now registered more than twice the number of new voters in the first six months this year. A lot of the success was due to our spring statewide school Voter Drive,

which began as a challenge from our 2018 grant and segued into a national movement resulting from the March for Our Lives rallies. Statewide this year, voter registration events were held at 34 schools, registering 811 students to vote!

In addition to school voter drives, there was lots of activity as nonstudents were also inspired to register. Here are statistics so far this year for other voter registration activity.

- -11 Naturalization Ceremonies registered 285 new voters, or 56% of new citizens following their ceremony.
- -18 events where the League was invited to attend, and 69 new voters were registered.
- -10 Voter Registration training sessions held statewide to share our 'lessons learned' when registering voters.
