

Summary of Changes in Maine's CI/PV Legislation Presented to the 129th Legislature (Updated by the LWVME Citizen Initiative Study Committee on 5/16/19)

Committee on State and Local Governments

<u>LD 1209</u>: An Act to <u>Require Legislative Hearings</u> on Citizen-initiated Legislation. OTP-AM; Passed to be enacted in both houses. Amendment allows for a waiver of the public hearing if voted on by 2/3 of members of each house. <u>5 testimonies</u>: Secretary of State (SoS)/Flynn in favor; Maine Heritage Policy Center (MHPC) in favor; one person against allowing "outsiders" to testify; none against.

Joint Standing Committee for Veterans and Legal Affairs Committee

<u>LD 252</u>: A resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Maine to <u>prohibit new or increased fees or taxes</u> by means of a direct initiative - <u>18 testimonies</u>: SoS Packard questioned ability of SoS to determine if an initiative involved tax increase; MHPC in favor; Maine Center for Economic Policy (MCEP) against. Reported out 3/25/19: 4/2/19 accepted ONTP/ONTP-AM / Dead.

<u>LD 255</u>: A resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Maine to require that <u>signatures</u> on a direct initiative <u>come from each Congressional District</u> - ANT. Hearings/<u>7</u> <u>testimonies</u> (several addressed LD 255 & LD 374 together): only one against; SoS neither for nor against; MHPC, Sportsman's Alliance, and NFIB Small Business Association all for. Divided Report 3/13; no further action.

<u>LD 294</u>: An act to require the <u>fiscal impact estimate</u> of a direct initiative to be included <u>on</u> <u>the ballot</u> - <u>3 testimonies</u>: SoS Packard NFNA but notes extra cost and potential problems; MHPC and a legislator for. Tabled/Dead in Senate 5/14.

<u>LD 374</u>: A resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution of Maine to require that signatures on a direct initiative come from <u>each Senatorial District</u>. Hearings/<u>7 testimonies</u> (similar to LD 255) - H:ONTP/S:ONTP/Dead.

<u>LD 499</u>: An Act To <u>Prohibit Payment per Signature</u> on Petitions for Direct Initiatives and People's Veto Referendums ANT. 3/27 work session & divided report—no further action; <u>10 testimonies</u>: SoS/Flynn provides history of similar legislation in ME and elsewhere and court rulings; all others in favor, often because they think it will decrease outside money.

LD 534: An act to <u>make ballot questions easier to read</u> and understand for Maine voters. Reported out/OTP-AM (removed specific reference to 6th grade reading level but calls for more specific description of what yes/no votes mean); <u>10 testimonies</u>: SoS/Flynn testimony opposed bill as initially drafted; LWVME Rawlings for, with amendment; most testimony in favor (including several town clerks and town clerk association).

<u>LD 1255:</u> A Resolution proposing an Amendment to the Constitution of Maine To <u>Require</u> <u>Referenda To Receive 60 Percent of the Vote</u> To Become Law - <u>5 testimonies</u>. Divided Report: Maj ONTP, Min OTP-AM/H: Roll Call-didn't pass/S: Filed/Dead (MHPC testified in favor and one Legislator; 3 private citizens against).
