LWVUS Immigration Study: Time to Take Consensus

Culmination of the LWVUS Two-Year Immigration Study

After Convention 2006, the League of Women Voters launched a two-year Immigration Study aimed at helping communities understand the implications of immigration at the local, state, and federal level. As part of this project, League members and leaders around the country and here in Maine have been exploring the underlying values and principles regarding immigration, reasons for immigration, current federal immigration policy, and the impact of immigration in American society. Other related topics covered include:

- business and economic effects and impacts
- diversity
- effects of global interdependence on immigration
- motivation of refugees, asylees and other immigrants

This study is entering the phase when Leagues prepare to take consensus. This will be the first consensus taken by the League in several years – many current League members have never been through a League consensus process.

Grassroots agreement on positions is one of the League's greatest strengths. Preparing for and taking consensus is hard work, but worthwhile. The resulting position will allow the organization to affect national policy for years to come, just as we have been doing in other areas for 87 years – it's part of the organization's history.

Timeline

• **September 2007 to January 2008** – Local leagues and ILO's take consensus

- **February 1, 2008** Deadline for the LWVUS to receive consensus response forms
- February 1, 2008 to March 20, 2008
- Immigration Study Committee formulates position
- Late March/early April 2008 The LWVUS Board adopts the position
